Boats, Floats, Moorings and Harbormaster News

"My Mooring Is Over That Way..."

Please do not bring your boat into the SWYC mooring area unless you know your mooring is serviced and ready, and you have personally checked it and can find it. Just because your mooring company found it or it was there last fall, (even worse, two years ago) doesn't mean it is still there or that you can find it. Guest moorings are to be used by members for true emergencies and guests. Your inattention to your mooring does not constitute an emergency! We have only two guest moorings. If six members ask to use them, guess what?

The launch operator will be happy to take you out to check your mooring on weekdays or non-peak times on a weekend. Consider using your hand-held GPS to mark the mooring coordinates so you can find it from the launch and your own boat. Please, please, please don't make problems for yourself and the club.

The contact information of the mooring companies that regularly do business in our area are listed on the web site.

Salem Harbormaster

- The Harbormaster will not renew a mooring permit unless the mooring has been serviced within 12 months. A copy of your service receipt from your mooring company should be included with your annual renewal application and check. Save your receipt from this year's service so you can send it next year.
- If you decide to not service and (by default) not to renew your permit because you are not using your boat, don't be surprised if the Harbormaster makes you pay all back fees or go on a waiting list for a permit when you decide to use your boat. Legally, the HM can pull any gear not registered by June 1.
- Getting a bigger boat? Don't assume you will be issued a permit for a bigger boat. The HM is concerned about boats being too close. Talk to the HM first and work with him.

Other Reminders

- Be sure you have adequate chafe gear on your mooring pennants. On average, we lose one boat per year to inadequate chafe gear.
- To keep pennants from wrapping around the mooring chain, use pool "noodles" or pipe insulation ty-wrapped to the pennants next to the mooring buoy.

"If Found" Stickers

If you have a dinghy without a motor, chances are that it's not registered with the State. The US Coast Guard Auxiliary has donated "If Found" stickers to be placed on your unregistered dinghy, canoe or kayak. If your watercraft should break free, this sticker will help identify it so it can be returned to the rightful owner. More importantly, the Coast Guard could know quickly if



the boat has just drifted off the dock or beach, or if there is someone in the water awaiting rescue. Without these stickers, a floating watercraft means a Search and Rescue mission must be launched. These missions cost an average of \$84,000 each time the Coast Guard goes out, and most times there is no one in danger.

The stickers are waterproof and reflective, and there is a place for your name (using a waterproof marker) and TWO phone numbers - a cell number and a secondary number of someone who could be contacted in case of an emergency. They should be placed in a highly visible location inside the vessel's cockpit or near the operator's station.

If you have an unidentifiable watercraft on the dinghy rack or rings, you are required to place one of these stickers inside so your vessel can be easily identified. Even if you have a registered dinghy, you are welcome to use these stickers to make it easier to contact you in case there is a problem. The stickers will be available at the launch shack or from your local harbormaster. Contact Steve Daly at ssdaly@verizon.net for more information.

2016 Launch Schedule

Sat. May 7: 9AM – 4PM The launch will be used to install the floats – limited availability for member services.

Sun. May 8: 9AM - 4PM

Mon. May 9 – Thurs. May 12: No Service

Fri. May 13: 4PM – 9PM

Sat. May 14 & Sun. May 15: 9AM - 4PM

Mon. May 16 - Wed. May 18: - No Service

Thurs. May 19 - Fri. June 17: 9AM - 9PM

Sat. June 18 – Mon. Sept 5: 8AM – 10PM

Tues. Sept 6- Sun. Sept 11: 9AM - 9PM

Mon. Sept 12-Close: 9AM - 7:30PM

Launch Guidelines:

- Our launch operators are required to take lunch and dinner breaks. Lunch is 1-1:30 and dinner is 7-7:30. Normally there will be no launch service during these break periods. The last launch will leave the float 10 minutes prior to the breaks and before closing. Please respect the operator's break time by not requesting service during these times.
- Per Coast Guard regulations governing the operation of our launches, we are limited to transporting only six passengers at any given time. During busy weekends, holidays and other times of high demand two launches will be in service. The BOG requests that only two crew members per boat be transported during peak times and that members pick up their remaining crew and guests at the floats. At these times the outboard side of the main float

will be reserved for loading and unloading passengers only. The BOG recognizes that during low tide some boats may not be able to use the float. If this is the case, the remaining crew and guests will be transported during subsequent launch trips two at a time.

Safety

No fuel, gas, diesel or propane may be transported on the launch.

The launch operator is in total command of the launch.

In order for the launch operator to have unobstructed vision all passengers are to remain seated at all times while the launch is underway.

Passengers are to assist the launch operator only if requested.

The launch will cease operation for 30 minutes once thunder/lightning is observed and return to operation 30 minutes after the last thunder/lightning.

During inclement weather members are advised to call the club to ensure the launch is operating.

All members are encouraged to be extra vigilant while underway in the mooring area as inflatables, kayaks, paddleboards and other small craft frequently pass through and can suddenly emerge undetected from behind a larger moored vessel.

Tipping

While tipping is not required, it is encouraged. Launch operators are paid minimum wage and depend on tips in order to make a decent wage. Tipping may be considered a "user fee system" whereby those who use the service pay for it.

\$1 per trip is adequate

\$2 per trip is appreciated

\$3 per trip the operators will love you

Club Etiquette

A	Please secure all nine windows, three doors, and turn off all lights if you lock up.
	Please remove your dirty dishes from the deck and wash them, and cover the grills if they're cool. Clean dishes are OK to leave in the rack to air dry.
	Please don't leave any trash outside in the park. Seagulls (aka winged rats) will attack uncovered trash, leaving a pile of empty adult beverage bottles. Please put all your trash in the barrels provided inside the gate.
	Please don't try to help the launch driver by pushing off unless he/she asks you to do so. We had a member almost go in the drink while standing on the gunnel of the launch, holding onto the rail and pushing off with his foot. The driver will frequently ask for help, but he/she must know what you are doing.
	Don't forget the number rule of the sea, "One hand for yourself and one for your water bottle". Always keep one hand (or preferably both) free to hold the rail on the launch or a solid part of the boat. If you have a lot of gear, send one person across first and then pass the gear.
	Please do not bring your vehicle into the park unless you are on official club business prepping for a function/delivering lumber etc. SWYC membership has worked hard since the club's inception to create goodwill with the city, please don't do anything to make the city think we are bad partners. Use the many carts to bring your gear to the club.
